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Presidents Report

The Past twelve months for the Te Atatu Memorial RSA has been very good. We are financially sound and have continued to upgrade facilities, assets and introduce more membership benefits.

The highlight of the year would have to be the hundred year commemorations of Anzac Day. While there was a committee to co-ordinate activities, several volunteers contributed in different ways. The decorations in the club were outstanding and suitably enhanced the whole event. The service in the new Community Centre was one of our best with over 600 people attending. The march with the vintage vehicles carrying our veterans and having our associate members also marching was the icing on the cake.

The handmade poppies deserve a special mention with the construction of the crosses and the wreaths. Some are still on display. This exercise also saved the club several hundred dollars. Every member who took part or contributed to this great event can be very proud of your effort. This is what makes us a great Club. We can now look forward to the next year and the 100 anniversary of the RSA.

Financially we had another good year. Net profit was down on last year by \$4,700 to \$73,800. However grants from gaming were the same for both years \$81,000. The capital development fund a reserve to purchase the land was also increased by another \$39,000. Bar sales drop by 1 % and gaming income down 9%. These figures are well above the overall National trends in hospitality. It is interesting to note the total cost of bar sales had a difference of only \$46 compared with last year when the cost of bar sales was \$326,195. Gaming expenses this year were down \$32,400 to \$470,000. These two key areas are under constant review with adjustments required made immediately.

Several functions and events were held during the year. Saturday night events have all proved popular and financially viable. The members Club day held at the end of January was one of the best-supported events we had in the club. The karaoke supported the event well. Two of these a year would be great. One area, which lacks support, is day outings for our senior members along the lines of the KEV trips. This will be worked on over the coming

months.

Work has continued on upgrading our facilities and assets. Final paperwork is being compiled in relation to new chairs and tables for the lounge. Final quotes have also been received for the painting of the walls. Gaming machines have been replaced and all are now compliant with Jackpot and DIA regulations. Our only cost now is for ten note converters when the new currency comes in at the end of this year.

The support courtesy van has been replaced with a new vehicle. While the old one was only purchased three years ago, it is imperative we have a van under warranty. We were presented with a good trade in offer and with the GST and depreciation taken into account the split cost from Support and Club was about \$11,000 each.

The sports clubs have had another good year with all the internal competitions being held and home, and away events with fellow clubs. These events are a major contribution to our bar takings. I applaud volunteers involved and challenge all too actively increase your membership. Darts must be congratulated for bringing Corban Cup events to the Club along the popular ham and chicken events.

Membership benefits are the key to retaining members and having new members join. Reduced bar prices, membership draws, Club days, courtesy van and support assistant are a few. The committee introduced \$10 off meals purchased on Wednesday and Sunday nights. Just swipe your card on payment to receive the discount. Four meals a month saves \$40. Please take advantage of this great offer.

Finally, I would like to thank Sharon Young who is standing down as the Women's Section President for her outstanding effort over the years. Our Women's Section with over 100 members would be one of the strongest in the Country. This reflects directly from Sharon's leadership skills. We all wish you a long relaxing retirement.

To the outgoing committee thank you for your enthusiastic loyal support over the year. I look forward to the next 12 months and RSA 100 year celebrations.

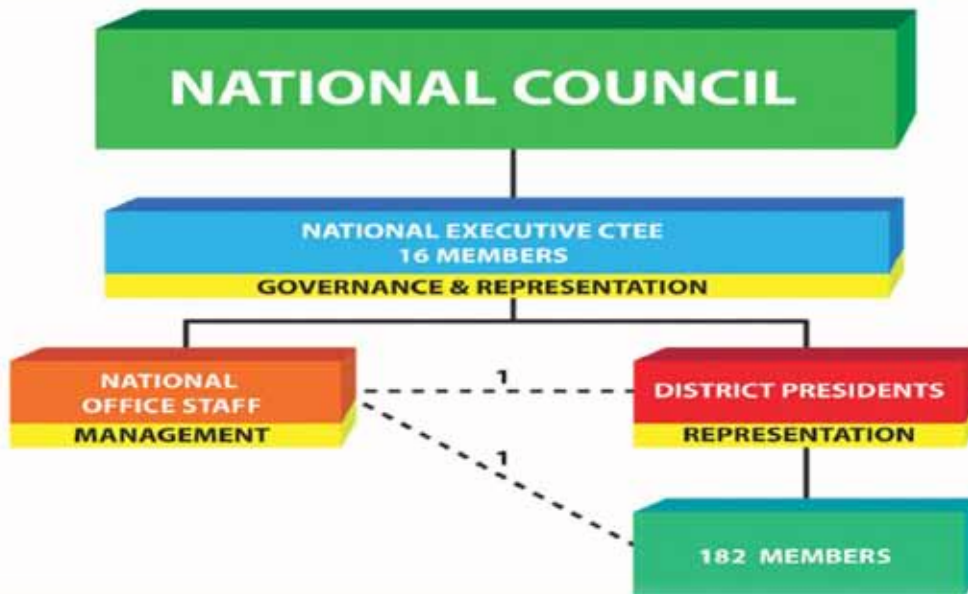

Te Atatu RSA Gaming Grants
JULY 2014 / JUNE 2015

2015 **Another Financial** year and I would like to thank members for their continual support . We have achieved a similar overall result to last year:

Poppy Day money increasing from last year with a total of \$9,316

Our **subscriptions** \$31,696 are up from last year 7.6%

Restaurant repairs and maintenance cost \$7,650 and continually needs our support.

\$29,000 has been added to our Capital Development fund

Upgrading Technology is a must and two new machines have been installed at a cost of \$38,500 funded from Gaming depreciation.

Another expense is the purchase of Note Acceptors to be compatible with the new dollar notes being printed.

A new **Electronic Monitoring System** installed costing \$5,910 to improve security.

Income from bar sales \$519,405 from last year \$524,178 giving 1% difference.

Our gaming sales has decreased 9% by \$47,738 this overall downward trend is nationwide.

With the difficult economic climate we have had a decrease in sales and this impacts on profit.
