Presidents Report

The past 12 months for The Te Atatu Memorial RSA overall has been very successful. We are financially sound, have upgraded member's facilities and continue to provide a variety of functions and events.

Trading conditions over the past year have been very challenging in relation to bar sales and gaming income. Bar sales were down 6.3 % and gaming income 11.3%. However, overall the club had an operating profit of \$78,000, an increase of \$6000 over the previous year.

The key to improving our income and sales is to encourage existing members to use the facilities and continue our drive for new members.

We have made major improvements to our club rooms. The Committee has been ahead of our target to upgrade over the next three years. The gaming room makeover, machine upgrades, new carpet and all the ceilings painted were completed. New furniture for the lounge is being negotiated and all the walls will be repainted for the summer. Our air conditioning unit is now effective after thirty eight old vents in the ceiling were removed and covered up.

Gaming is a major source of income for the club. Profit from the machines can be used for authorised expenses with the balance available for distribution to community organisations. It gives me great pleasure to report that 53% of the funds available were distributed to 16 of our local community groups. This amount totalled \$21,231.

Once again the club provided several entertainment opportunities for member's to attend. ANZAC day was one out of the box having an outdoor service on our local Village Green. The setting was great and the weather was kind. Next year and service will be back in the new community centre.

The dine and dance annual event was sold out a month in advance

and the comedy nights have proven to be very successful both financially and with the numbers attending.

Next year is 100th anniversary of ANZAC day. Commemoration services events and functions will be held Nationally in the District and locally over the twelve month period. Notification of these events will be passed on to all members once full details have been advised. We currently have a sub committee looking into a number of local functions.

At the RSA National conference a vote of no confidence in the National Executive Council was put forward after accumulated losses of \$800,000 over the past three years.

The National Council decided that an independent task force be setup to urgently review the RNZ RSA, s dated governance and management structure. The Task Force has completed the review with recommendations for a simpler cleaner and more efficient structure. The report and recommendations will be presented to National Council this year.

The club is now a member of Clubs New Zealand. This immediately gives all members reciprocal membership to another three hundred Clubs in New Zealand and opens the doors to another 300,000 guests with reciprocal rights. Clubs New Zealand are the country's leaders in hospitality and gaming. They provide a superior service for clubs when compared with NZRSA. We now have the best of both worlds. Our Club has already made significant savings since joining.

The strength of our club is directly related to the voluntary contributions of several members in different areas. The Woman Section with Sharon Young as President has once again provided outstanding support to the RSA. The sports sections, their officials and members I thank you for your contribution. Ian Henry our Support Advisor and his team have excelled. Members support in the very key for our existence. Finally to the outgoing Committee thank you for your effort to make the club a better place. I look forward to the next 12 months and 100 year commemorations.

Treasurer's Report

Te Atatu RSA Gaming Grants
JULY 2013 / JUNE 2014

This financial year the main expenditure incurred has been the upgrading of the Gaming area at a cost of \$94,000 of which \$76,225 was funded from gaming depreciation, replacement of Carpet \$52,323, upgrading of CCTV cameras \$10,410 and Sports Lounge Tables and Chairs \$10,452.

Support Services expenses continue to decrease. The balance in the Poppy Day Fund is \$12,692

Whilst the net profit for the year is comparable to last year we did not incur the \$67,298 loss from the Restaurant nor the \$50,000 grant to the Development account which was in last year's accounts.

Income from bar sales has decreased by \$38,549 and gaming \$65,971. Operational expenses have been reviewed and savings maximised, restructuring of policies and accountability has been completed including an upgrade to the computer financial and wages systems. The committee receive Monthly and YTD financial reports also Gaming, Grants and budgeted large expenditure reports.

For the club to continue to be financially viable and have funds to purchase the land in the future the committee is going to have to increase revenue.

In the ongoing difficult economic environment greater governance and financial expertise is going to be required from the committee to assure the ongoing future success of the RSA.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE, 2014

1. Reporting entity

The entity is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

The entity qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and there is no separation between the owners and governing body. The entity has taken advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions.

2. Measurement base

The measurement systems adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are historical cost unless otherwise stated.

3. Specific accounting policies

The following are the accounting policies which have a material effect on the measurement of financial performance and financial position:

(a) Depreciation

Depreciation has been claimed in accordance with the rates specified by the Income Tax Act.

(b) Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable are valued at expected realisable value.

(c) Stock on hand

Stock is stated at its average cost.

(d) Goods and services tax

These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis. All GST has been accounted for in the Statement of Financial Position with the exception of irrecoverable GST which has been recognised as part of the related asset or expense where applicable.

(e) Tangible assets

Tangible assets are valued at cost less ordinary depreciation provided to date.

(f) Profits and losses on disposals

Profits or losses in the normal course of business on disposal of tangible assets and investments are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit, with the exception of profit in excess of the original cost of an asset, which is credited direct to capital reserves.

(g) Investments

Investments are recorded at cost.
