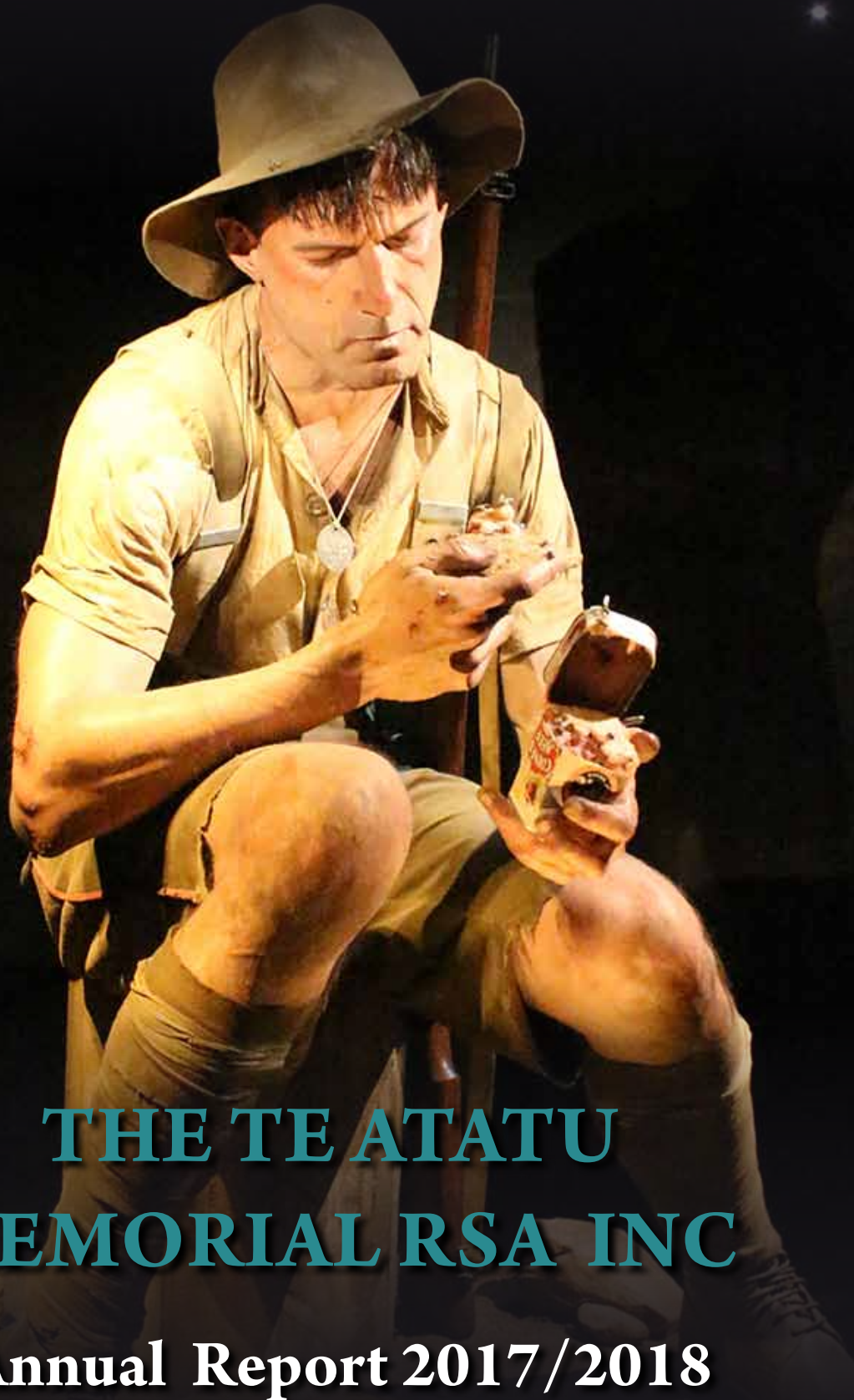

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Presidents Report

The past twelve months for Te Atatu Memorial RSA has been very challenging for all associated with the running of the club. A net profit of \$978 seems insignificant, however with all the variables taken into account it is an acceptable

result. Poppy funds of \$9,165 were deposited with the Ranfurly Trust which would normally appear in our accounts and \$6,100 members restaurant promotions (\$5 off Wednesdays meals) is an expense off the bottom line. New fixed assets purchase totalled \$64,777.

Total income bar trading was up \$9,000 on the previous year and the gross profit was 60.29%. Our goal is to retain GP above 60%. If this can be maintained bar prices will remain the same, however if this dropped bar prices would be increased as was pointed out in the July newsletter.

Gaming income was down \$15,000 or 3.5% compared with the previous twelve months. This is a good result when compared with the Regional and National trends of gaming. Most Clubs are suffering from a 10% plus downturn takings.

The Club is now a member of The Poppy Foundation of Auckland Trust. The Deed of Participation was signed November 2017 which formally attaches the Club to the Ranfurly Veterans Trust. We deposit all poppy money collected into the Trust and claims for assistance are processed monthly. As at the 30th June 2018 we deposited \$9,165. A total of fourteen applicants have been reimbursed \$10,418 over the past 4 months. Being part of this Trust has secured the future for our Returned / Service and dependants who are members of our Club and may need financial support with a variety of medical conditions well until the next century. This is why the RSA was formed 103 years ago.

During the year we were informed that Auckland Council would not allow the RSA to purchase leasehold land the club is situated on. Our current lease expires 2033 which gives us 15 years to investigate the physical future of the club. This is not very far away. (The millennium was 18 years ago) An action plan needs to be initiated over the next few years. Normally the lease would be renewed however alternatives must be investigated. Over the past year RSA's nationally and in the Auckland Region have either closed down, merged with another Club or are struggling financially. There are a variety of reasons why this has occurred but the one common denominator is that members are not using the facilities. All Clubs need foot traffic through the door to survive. Our Club needs more members using the facilities on a regular basis. With 700 associate members on our books the future of our club is entirely in your hands.

Over the year we hold our regular formal and social events. Anzac Day was a huge success. We changed the format which allowed only members and affiliates into the club before 1.30 p.m. on the day. This created a lot more space and an improved social environment for all the members. Deidre Rich and the dedicated Women's section did an excellent lunch and provided just under 300 meals as well as feeding all children and parents in the Bowling Club. Again they performed equally as well with the children's Christmas function and Veterans Day. The women's section play a major role in the overall success of the club and long may it continue. We need your support.

At National RSA headquarters the Board is now well-established and the emphasis is certainly trending towards support services which is great. This is by far the organisations strength with ceremonial and membership administration. Regrettably there has been little progress on working with Clubs N Z to advise on liquor licensing, gaming regulations, food and hygiene requirements and employment. National RSA have limited experience in the above areas.

Several Clubs have recognised a breakdown between the President's forum and National Board. As a result of this, Te Atatu and Swanson have put forward a remit to National Council that the RSA National President should also be the chairman of the board. One head of the organisation, this should be discussed at National Council if it is accepted by the President's Forum.

All Sports sections have once again made a major contribution to the Clubs success. One in particular is competition darts. We have seen the numbers swell to over forty competitive players participating on Saturday afternoons and Tuesday evenings. This has only been achieved with the excellent support and dedication of Russell Packard. Keep up the good work.

Unfortunately, with several members moving out of Te Atatu the fishing club has closed down and the golf section has slowed down after several Auckland RSA's have cancelled annual tournaments.

The support service team of Ian Henry, Richard Patterson and the volunteer drivers have again had a busy year. Ian does an outstanding job coordinating the team and keeping in touch with members in hospitals, rest homes and living alone. We are extremely fortunate to have Stephen Enger as our Secretary Manager with his professional skills and experience. He leads a dedicated team of enthusiastic individuals and liaises with all the volunteers and outside organisations to make this club a successful business.

Finally to the outgoing committee thank you for your support over the past 12 months. It's been a pleasure to be your President.

This year SUBSCRIPTIONS had a 2.9% decline and the Committee approved application of 59 New Members.

Our NET PROFIT for the year ended 30th June 2018 is \$977.69

Bar Sales up 1.9% Gaming Income down 3.4%

MAINTENANCE costs continue to increase and due to age of Plant and Property this will only accelerate

One Snooker table and three Pool Table cloths were re-covered at \$4,500.00

GAMING GRANTS 2018 Total \$17,021.82

NEW FIXED ASSETS 2018 Total \$64,777.61

PROMOTION and ENTERTAINMENT costs increased

Sunday night meals with a \$5 discount to all members is available

POPPY MONEY 2018 Total \$6,175.30

All Poppy money now goes to The Poppy Foundation of Auckland Trust.

To comply with IRD all GST assessments are to be included with TeAtatu RSA accounts using the Clubs GST number. We have now combined RSA Sections in an ADJUNCT account for their use keeping all financial transactions separate and confidential. On behalf of Golf, Pool, Snooker and Women Section we invested a combined \$21,000 in a Term Deposit for 6 months Resulting in Higher Interest for all.

RSA INVESTMENTS are still monitored for best return and the Interest is reinvested with capital on maturity.

Looking towards the future we have looked at other Accounting Systems and have decided to stay with MYOB in the cloud.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE, 2018

1. Reporting entity

The entity is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice.

The entity qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and there is no separation between the owners and governing body. The entity has taken advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions.

2. Measurement base

The measurement systems adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are historical cost unless otherwise stated.

3. Specific accounting policies

The following are the accounting policies which have a material effect on the measurement of financial performance and financial position:

(a) Depreciation

Depreciation has been claimed in accordance with the rates specified by the Income Tax Act.

(b) Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable are valued at expected realisable value.

(c) Stock on hand

Stock is stated at its average cost.

(d) Goods and services tax

These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis. All GST has been accounted for in the Statement of Financial Position with the exception of irrecoverable GST which has been recognised as part of the related asset or expense where applicable.

(e) Tangible assets

Tangible assets are valued at cost less ordinary depreciation provided to date.

(f) Profits and losses on disposals

Profits or losses in the normal course of business on disposal of tangible assets and investments are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit, with the exception of profit in excess of the original cost of an asset, which is credited direct to capital reserves.

(g) Investments

Investments are recorded at cost.

Opinion
